CTAA Minutes, January 12, 2017

President Gale Cochran-Smith called meeting to order, and passed out current membership list. Everyone pays dues based on the month they started their membership. Gwen Coulson gave the Treasurer's report at \$529.20.

Discussion on CTAA Western Art Show & Sale:

- 1. Gale handed out flyers for the show
- 2. Jennifer Hammer stated she's emailed the flyer and prospectus to groups, and it's located on the CTAA Facebook page.
- 3. Discussion followed on whether pottery and metal works are acceptable, and it was decided by the group that all kinds of art are eligible provided the art fits the theme of the show.
- 4. Entries are due by June 1, 2017.
- 5. Awards will be:
- a. Best of Show
- b. Best Theme
- c. Best of show in each category
- 6. Long discussion on clarifying/changing the entry price, or not. It will remain as detailed on the prospectus \$35 per entry. For members, it's \$25 per entry that had been forgotten, and Jennifer will send email update to all members with that notice.

Reminder that Soon Warren will present a watercolor workshop on July 26-28, 2017.

The deadline to apply is April 3, 2017. Material has been sent to high schools for seniors. Jack Michanowski did present the scholarship with certificate for 2016.

Gale presented information on:

a Logo contest for the Vicari Auction and Cruisin event in Nocona - due January 23, 2017.

- b. Nocona Chamber of Commerce will sponsor a Mardi Gras Kids art show. The CTAA will not be involved.
- c. Asked for anything new, and asked everyone to take the cards and mail them to artists they may know.

Jack was the presenter for tonight's meeting and had a problem with the connections and his laptop, so he couldn't show us the photo shop layering program. He showed some of his digital painting using layers - very good artwork and interesting process. He will try to make the electronics work at a later meeting.

Gale demonstrated how she puts a picture together by using pieces from other downloaded pictures found on the web, cuts and pastes until she gets a subject she likes, and then copies onto her watercolor paper. She'll use her presentation for the CTAA Western Art Show.

Cecilia Ashley mentioned the December 17, 2017, Quilt raffle for the Century Club in St Jo. The design matches the time-frame for the western art show, so the suggestion was made to enter it in the show first, and if not sold, then raffle it in December.

It also appears that the legislature may make the Bowie knife the state knife. More on that at a later time.

Larry discussed using FB as a business page. At the bottom of a post is a button for "boost item." If you use that, it gives you options on cost and the number of people your post will be forwarded - can be 1,200 and up depending on your payment. He has used that quite successfully in selling his prints. He also discussed having prints made from your work, and not numbering them - just signing and selling them. Most artists are not business inclined, and his discussion made sense.

Rita Dyer gave a wonderful spontaneous presentation on a challenge she accepted to paint 40 paintings in 40 days. It started because her son-in-law met artist Gwen Fox, and Rita took a abstract painting workshop from Gwen. Gwen challenged her to do a painting every day for 40 days. The paintings were done in acrylic and were all sizes. We had a lively discussion on what other artists could see in her work. Lots of fun!

Vonnie Kohn won Artist of the Month with her oil painting of her granddaughter.

CTAA JANUARY 12TH METING

Our January meeting was our "Show & Tell" presentation featuring various members sharing things they are working on, have done recently, want help with or just wanted to tell everyone about something new. This is always a great way to learn new things or have input about something you might have hit that road block on and have that fresh perspective.

Jack Milchanowski had technical difficulties with bringing us a demo on the layering process in Photoshop.

Rita Rae Dryer brought her 40 paintings in 40 days challenge to show which were great.

Larry Lemons shared a marketing idea about Facebook business pages and how their "boost" button has helped spread the number of views which has boosted his sales.

Cecilia Ashley mentioned a raffle from the Century Club in Saint Jo which will be held December 17, 2017. The quilt ties in with our theme for the art show of the Chisholm Trail time period so could end up as an entry in the show instead.

Gale Cochran-Smith showed how she sets up her printed images she wants to use for a watercolor by arranging the images until she finds the composition she like the best and then taping the images together. After that she transfers the image to her watercolor paper to begin painting.

We are excited to have Joshua Bradley from Wichita Falls give our presentation for February. Joshua is a native Texan, he exercises unique style of wood turning in creating his fine bowls, vases, and urns. Most designs start with a sketch or idea, and a pattern is worked out on paper. Then using either domestic and /or imported hardwoods and a process called "segmented turning," each creation begins by gluing many pieces of wood together to make a block, which is then turned on a lathe. It often takes several weeks to complete each piece.

There are no paints, stains or color additives added to the wood, and the finished colors are that of the natural wood. We hope you will join us for this very interesting presentation!
