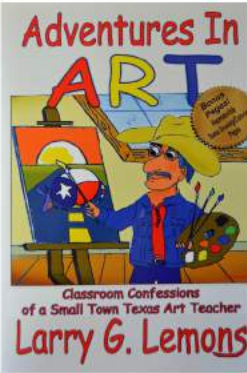

September 13, 2018



We met for dinner at the Pizzeria in Nocona first, then headed across the street to Larry Lemon's Studio and Gallery.

President Gale Cochran-Smith opened the meeting.

The Treasurer's report showed \$1,344.69. That was after donating \$500 to the Kemp for their Camp-On-the-Go for Artwork, in honor of Rusty Cook.

Gale with Larry discussed the upcoming October, November and December meetings.

- Upcoming programs:

- o October 11 – Larry has scheduled Michael Sloat, a helicopter pilot and nationally known photographer.
- o November 8 – We'll have Randy Oberbeck, and Air Brush Artist.
- o December – We'll have the Christmas party at the Bank.
- o We've also scheduled Soon Warren's 2019 watercolor workshop for July 19, 20, 21. If you haven't been to one, put it on your calendar, and plan to attend.

We briefly discussed the Holiday Art Show & Sale in Duncan, OK. There are 3 categories, and dollar prizes. The Best of Show would be awarded \$450. Please go to the CTAA web site for postings of that show along with other art shows.

Gale turned the meeting over to Larry who gave us a lesson in photographing your art in order to get professional shots and prints from those shots. Larry demonstrated in his "dark room," what kind of lighting to use, and exactly how to remove the glare and extra "stuff" that most photographs will show. He uses foil in a very interesting process. He's also a firm believer of using a good tripod to stabilize your camera to eliminate "shake." Larry gave a demonstration on the use of PhotoShop 6.0 to adjust prints for sending to various art shows.

Larry also discussed the possibility of displaying art at the Nocona Library, and he offered artists a far room in his gallery – with window space – to display our artwork. Talk to Larry about that option.

We did not have Artist of the Month for this meeting.

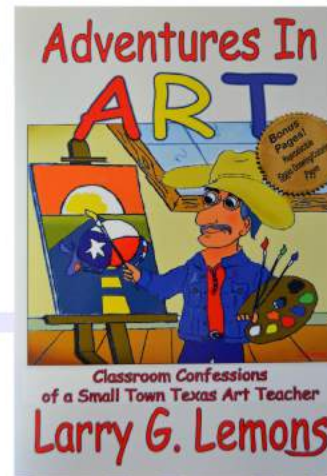

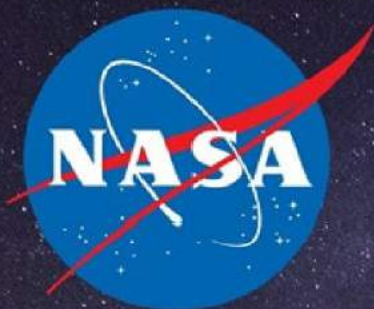

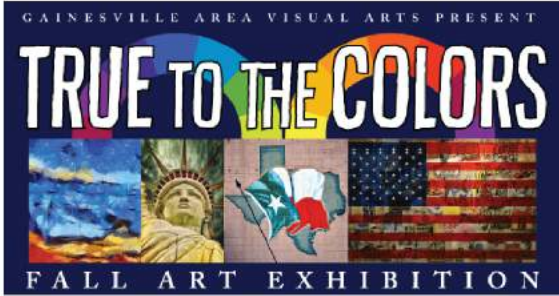

2018 Art Exhibit

Saturday October 6, 2018

In conjunction with Chicken and Bread Days Heritage Festival

Following are BAEA guidelines to be used to facilitate this exhibit:

1. All pieces must be dry and 'ready to hang'. **Due to space limitations and respect for other members, please limit pieces to approximately 24" x 30" in dimension.** On the back of each piece, permanently attach your name, title of piece, dimensions, medium and price or followed by "NFS" (Not For Sale) if appropriate.
2. Three-dimensional work must be able to stand on its own. Your information label must be securely attached to the piece, yet easily removable by staff.
3. **All work must be new to this 2018 exhibition.**
4. The Bowie Alliance for Education and the Arts reserves the right to reject any piece of work which, in its opinion, does not serve the mission of the Alliance, reflect acceptable social standards, or meet all requirements stated herein.
5. Work must be **delivered on Friday October 5, 2018 between the hours of noon and 6:00 p.m.** for inclusion in the exhibit. Work should be delivered to the Bowie Community Room, 307 N Mason Street.
6. Work must be **picked up on Saturday October 6, 2018 between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m.** No work may be removed from the exhibit before this time. Work to be picked up at the Bowie Community Room, 307 N Mason Street.
7. If someone other than the artist is to pick up your pieces they must present a picture ID to the Bowie Alliance for Education and the Arts representative at the end of the show.
8. The Alliance requires a 20% donation on sales of work during the exhibit. Consider this when you price each piece. Please place a value on your work, or NSF if it is not for sale. **Please note, for pieces sold which total \$600 or greater, you must provide your social security number to receive payment. (Tax Laws).**
9. **Awards reception at 3:30 p.m. October 6, 2018.**

Mike is a native Texan and lives in Fort Worth. He is a decorated 40-year career military pilot, he has traded in his wings now, translating his enthusiasm for flying into being an avid photographer. It was more than 50 years ago that Mike picked up his first camera, a Kodak Box Camera. Mike has always had an interest in photographing wildlife, landscape and people playing or working.

Mike uses Nikon D810 and D5 equipment and is currently sUAS (drone) certified commercial pilot using Dji equipment.

Mike has always said, "A photograph occurs in a fraction of a second when the photographer releases the shutter." With Mike's images, this takes the viewer to that magical place and space in time. Through sharing these images and teaching workshop groups, Mike hopes to motivate others to appreciate, preserve and protect our environment for our future generations. Mike's images are a representation of his ideals not only concerning nurturing our environment, but also in respect for all the animals and the landscape. The wildlife in Mike's images are not, tamed, caged, nor are they from game farms. No animals were harmed in any way and they are left to live in their own natural environment.

Mike's work has been featured in such publications as Texas Highways, Nature Photography, Audubon, Texas Parks and Wildlife, Texas Monthly, Travel Host magazines, Corpus Christi Convention & Visitors Bureau, Port Aransas Chamber of Commerce, International Crane Foundation, Bugle Magazine and Wind Sport Magazine. Most of the images are from the Texas Gulf Coast, but some are from Alaska, Colorado, Oklahoma, Utah, Wyoming, Montana, Washington D.C. and New Mexico.
