Minutes from Meeting - November 14, 2019

Treasurer's Report was given by Gwen Coulson. The Association has a balance of \$2,058.64 in our account at Wellington State Bank as of 10/30/19.

Report was given by Larry G. Lemons on the Nocona Nights Music Festival / Art of the Song Art Show & Sale. We had 38 entries, some from "first timers" to our show. Initially we set up at the back of the Justin Building, but were told by the Nocona Nights people to move to the front - which was a much better location to display the art and attract people in to see the art work. At the awards ceremony there were about 60 people in attendance, and traffic into and out of the building was good, especially on Saturday. The Nocona Nights people were very pleased to have the art be part of the event and want us back next year: October 16, 17, and 18, 2020.

Suggestions were given from Jennifer Hammer and Larry on things to change for next year, and the members in attendance also entered into the discussion: (1) Bring back Peoples' Choice Award instead of the CTAA Choice Award. Add numbers to each entry to make voting easier; (2) Art drop off to be at the Justin Building (instead of Larry's gallery) the day before we hang the show (special arrangements can be made if that is not possible for an artist); (3) Charge \$35 for one or two entries, with at least one entry having to be a music theme and any subsequent entries not having to conform to the theme; (4) Patrons' Award and Best of Show Awards are only for music themed entries, learning 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and honorable mentions to be for all work entered, (5) all work entered must be for sale; and (6) all work must have been created within the past two years and not shown at any previous CTAA/NNMF show.

Jennifer gave the results of poling for the number of art shows we put on each year, and it was overwhelming for two shows - one in the spring that is the CTAA Art Show, and the Nocona Nights Show in the fall. The CTAA show will not have a theme. It was brought up that if we do, in fact, put on two shows a year - we need to have our own art panels rather than borrow Larry's. Different types of panels will be explored and voted on at our January meeting. Cost of good quality panels for our needs will run between \$700 and \$1000.

Different art workshops were discussed for next year: March 28 - April 4 is Jan Thompson's pastel workshop at the 404 Ranch near Stephenville. It includes room and food. Soon Warren's watercolor workshop is at the Central Christian Church in Nocona on June 10, 11, & 12. We will start taking deposits after January 1st, 2020 but already have a very large contact list for it. Randy Meador's watercolor workshop in Saint Jo will be sometime in October. The next art show is the Red River Valley Museum's show in May/June with entries due January 13th. Information about upcoming art shows and workshops can be found on the group's website and Facebook page.

Discussion was made about the location for our annual Xmas party, as Sharon Brown had graciously offered her home for the event. The group, however, voted to keep it in a more centralized location (Bowie) to insure those members located far south would be able to attend. Jesse and Gwen offered their church (7th Day Adventist Church in Bowie - subject to their Board approval which could be obtained at their meeting on the 24th). Failing that, we will have our party at the bank.

Gale talked about our annual sponsorship in memory of Rusty Cooke of the Kemp Center's annual children's art program called ArtZeum. She also read a thank you letter from the Wichita Falls Arts Council and Kemp Center for our continuing support. This year's theme was insects, and the kids imagined a world with giant insects, looked at insects through microscopes, and even got to learn about eating bugs! And, of course, they got to draw and paint insects.

Larry introduced our featured artist, Retha Bond, from GAVA in Gainesville, who talked about her collage art Retha has a masters degree in art and has taught art for over 50 years. She and her husband also owned a jewelry store for over 40 years. She primarily works in mixed media, having "found" collage only in the past four years. Her paintings are on display through December at the First Presbyterian Church library in Gainesville and at Liberty Crossing.

Artist of the Month was Jesse Coulson for his photograph "Blue Swallow Motel, Route 66."


