own entry for "constructive" critique & discuss what he/she liked or needed to improve.

Critiques are a way to see through the eyes of other artists what is needed for self improvement. Several artists contributed their ideas according to the basic elements of art/photography. Basic Guidelines for Judging (according to photography/ basic art values): A list of 12 guidelines was presented by Pres. Larry Lemons. Following is a summary of those guidelines for members. • Impact: The "wow" factor..compelling, emotional • Creativity: Originality in idea, message, thought • Style: specific genre, light, use of color, etc. • Composition: design, using all the visual elements to express purpose of image • Presentation of Artwork: (if a print, mats & borders should support, not detract from art; if painting, the frame should not overwhelm the painting but enhance it) • Center of Interest (focal point). Should be primary & secondary centers of interest. Sometimes the

center of interest is the entire subject matter • Lighting: (use/ control of light-photography)..refers to how dimension, shape, roundness define an image. In painting, the direction, time of day dictates the progression of the image. It also defines an emotional reaction to artwork • Subject matter: Does the subject portrayed relate to the title? • Color Balance: (pertains to photography)..supplies harmony to an image. Can be used to evoke emotional responses to artwork or photos • Technical Excellence: print quality of image... IE.., sharpness, exposure, printing, mounting, correct color all speak to qualities of physical print. (Not too light, dark in value) • Storvelling: the ability to evoke

physical print. (Not too light, dark in value) • Storytelling: the ability to evoke imagination... each viewer might interpret message personally. Does the art/ print "have" to tell a story each time? Page 3 Prospective Programs for 2021: President Lemons invited members to suggest new programs for the New Year (2021).
