Larry asked all of us to stand, give our names and tell all what kind of art we do, where we live, etc. We have new members and that was a good introduction from all of us. Larry also presented Gale Cochran-Smith gifts for being CTAA President for the past 10 years. She received a beautiful plaque and a gift certificate to Fenoglio's BBQ.Gwen Coulson gave the Treasurer's report, which showed \$3,845.76 in our account

Upcoming Workshops:

Soon Warren Workshop: The workshop (June 10, 11, & 12) is full with a waiting list. Gale has checks from the first 20 people @ \$50 each.

The workshop costs \$250/person, and all attendees will be expected to pay the remaining \$200 at the start of the workshop

Jan Thompson will hold her Pastel Workshop March 29-April 4. The cost will be \$950, which includes room and board.

Jennifer Hammer will hold a pastel workshop on July 18 & 19 at the Tales and Trails Museum. The cost is \$100, and a \$50 deposit is

required to hold your spot. As of our meeting, the workshop was half full. Everyone is urged to take advantage of the workshop. You will provide your supplies, and Jennifer has a list of those items.

New Items:

Larry mentioned that the Mind's Eye Group plays 50s-70s music, and on April 4, 2020, there will be a Veranda event to raise money for charity. The group has already raised approximately \$20,000 for charitable causes. More information will follow, but Larry encouraged all to add the event to their calendars.

Gale reported that the Frame Shop in Bowie was now fully open and operating. She urged everyone to take advantage and use the store for framing needs.

Guest Artist:

Larry introduced Laurie Sawyer from Gainesville as our visiting artist. Laurie had been one of Larry's students, but it was a workshop with Jenny Doh in Denver in 2018, that got her interested in loose painting and a different method of portrait painting. She showed quite a few varied examples. Laurie primarily paints shapes and shades and lays it all out on a grid - she used her working portrait of Patrick Mahomes (KC Chiefs QB) as an example. She mainly uses two apps to lay out her portraits in a grid methodology – "See Value," and "Accuresee," Both aps can be found at the app store. Laurie discussed that she uses straight strokes to paint, and that you have to use Caucasian skin color somewhere in the painting, along with blue, red, warm grey, unbleached titanium, and she uses burnt sienna + Gamisol as a base. Her ending glaze is walnut oil, and she hasn't varnished. She said she mainly gets her commissions by word-of-mouth or FB. She did ask if any of us had a preferred varnish, and conservator's varnish was mentioned. We thanked her for the interesting presentation.

Larry thanked Donna for the treats – they were yummy.

Artist of the month was won by Vonnie Kohn with her oil – The Vaquero.

The meeting was then adjourned.



Painting historical scenes from one of America's

favorite real-life stories can mean you don't get a lot of leeway in how you depict things. Lee Cable was approached by Jim Parkman about painting a series of pieces depicting the life and accomplishments of

Charles Goodnight, a hero among Texans and

cattlemen of all kinds. Goodnight found a way to drive eattle to market that exposed the drive to the smallest amount of hostilities with

Native Americans and outlaws. He also pioneered the marketing of longhorn cattle, which could survive the rough conditions on the

trail through Texas and up through New Mexico to

Fort Sumner. He invented the concept of the

chuckwagon. But when an artist depicts a historical figure, some hard decisions need to be made. The biggest question is how much of a stickler for factual detail the painter will be.

In the case of Charles Goodnight, much is written, but not much is illustrated. That meant Cable had to read journals, letters, and other research material carefully to determine what Goodnight probably wore, rode, and saw on his historic cattle drives. But it became clear to Cable that he was going to have to invent much in the paintings. That suited him fine. Parkman asked Cable for some ideas for paintings, and Cable came up with 95 of them. They decided to shoot for 25 concepts. The first seven paintings went on view at the Museum of Western Art in Kerville, Texas. Cable admitted to being a little nervous before

the opening. This is a pictorial interpretation of our view of his life. It is historical, I want the focus to be on Charles Goodnight. That's why we are doing this series. Most people just know "Lonescone Dove", the miniseries based on Charles Goodnight and Oliver Loring,

"This is my concept of what I read", says

Cable. "People will be hard pressed to say that it

didn't happen the way I depicted it, but still, it is my conjecture of what happened. There weren't any



We will start with our darkest, hardest darks using paper color and/or washes we make with pastels. Then we will progress toward the light by using softer, lighter pastels. I will discuss what pastel is in case you are a beginner.

We will work from your photos which, hopefully, will have good contrast and composition. Depending on skill levels, we will copy photos or jump ahead to adding our own ideas to the paintings.

I begin with a short demo, then do individual help. Any skill level is fine as we all enjoy critique and learning from each other. We will also learn about shapes, values, hard and soft edges and how to create the illusion of 3-D on a 2-D surface.

First and foremost we will learn how to look at our beautiful world (grass, sky, clouds, rocks, trees, etc) and then attempt to express them on paper. It is my hope that we will be able to convey our responses to our viewers with some good paintings. When learning any skill, one must practice to become proficient, just as the musician learns his scales the artist must learn the basics before good art can be produced.

Whether or not you have ever used pastels, I know you will enjoy their immediacy and vibrant colors. Painting with pastels is drawing and painting at the same time...very fun!

Practice on wet/dry sandpaper from Home Depot; Maggie Price's book "Painting with Pastels" is a good basic read; Dick Blick Art Supply Warehouse good supply source.
