
CTAA October Meeting Minutes

Gale Cochran-Smith called meeting to order @ 6:00. (Larry Lemons, president, is in quarantine due to family member) Treasurer's Report: Gwen stated the balance for CTAA was \$ 2205.12. Old Business: No Update on Christmas Party. Date is set for 2nd Thursday, Dec. 2020. It was suggested that we have the party catered. Jesse Coulsen stated he is waiting on confirmation on the Christmas Party at the same Fellowship hall at his church (Seventh Day Adventist, Bowie). Liz is tasked with checking out catering sources for this year's party. New Business: Gale proposed having a Members Only Art Show during our November meeting; Darlene made a motion to schedule the show, Jesse Coulsen seconded, the vote was unanimous. This show offers a \$ 50 gift certificate from Cheap Joe's. Bring your entries, members! Guest Artist: Jim Stevens, photographer, of Azle, Tx. Jim Stevens attended the Brookes Institute of Arts & Sciences in California, the same school that Larry Lemons attended, later earning a Masters Degree. His Page 2 first employment was at Foley's Department Store in Houston as one of eleven photographers in product photography. He later moved to Ft Worth, specializing in commercial photography & portraits. Included in his resume is that of adjunct professor at Sam Houston State University, at a Houston art college for 10 years, and currently as a photography teacher at the Azle High School. Jim works with a 4 x 5 format camera which uses the 8 x 10 negative plate. Jim explained this gives the most detailed image per square inch in a photograph. He formerly worked with a SLR single & double reflex camera using roll film; however the digital camera and the computer began to revolutionize the photography industry, replacing the roll film entirely. Jim brought several prints of his travels throughout the Southwest including a triplex comparison of images of the same location with 2 other photographers (Tim O'Sullivan-1873 and Ansel Adams-1942). His was made in 2018. Jim noted that he loves a lot of foreground, texture, and extreme lighting effects (early morning, late evening). His genre includes landscapes, animals, national parks. "Technology has changed; creative eye has not" (Jim's quote) Jim says the photographer has to imagine the image even before taking the photo. It is important to be able to dictate what the camera should do...then it becomes ART! 

Unconventional Surfaces: Exploring new ways to paint with watercolor




Workshop with Justin Burns at the Fort Worth Community Arts Center.
