May Guest Artist: Karen Kennedy Chatham Statement: "I am an equine/ abstract artist, painting as a servant to bring connection to our Creator" Karen begins her painting by preparing the surface of the canvas with 6-10 layers of gesso, smoothing the surface between layers. She then uses an electric sander halfway through the process, then after final layer of gesso to prepare for a layer of matte medium to create "tooth." Using separate brushes (according to color), she applies paint in an analogous method (neighboring colors on color wheel) randomly on the canvas while listening to Christian music for inspiration. Working with separate brushes for color helps her to select color quickly while avoiding the muddying of her paint. Karen does not clean her brushes between strokes as his would dilute the application of paint too much. She also uses no medium to apply the paint. Using a variety of brushstrokes, she also implements the use of a palette knife with angular & flat large brushes to apply a thick impasto of paint. It's important to scrub the paint into the surface of the canvas as "carving" reveals underlying colors in a later procedure. Page 3 The next step is most critical: blend lightly with clean soft synthetic brushes, keeping separation of clean brushes consistent with painting technique to avoid "mud." Surface becomes velvety smooth. Wait about 30 minutes to wait for paint to reach "tacky" quality, then use a 3rd brush to "fine tune" certain areas, creating texture. To Carve: Listening to her music, Karen intuitively carves certain areas of her painting using various tools, including a rubber wedge and a variety of kitchen spatulas. The result is a lifting of paint to reveal a rainbow of glowing color! The carving process has a lyrical rhythmic quality reflecting the flow of music. The title of her canvas is: "Safe in Your Arms" inspired by the same song by Josh
