August Guest Artist: Shannon Smith Ms.

Smith is currently an art instructor (with an emphasis in ceramics) in her 3rd year of teaching at Nocona High School. She was responsible for instituting the "AP" program in art to the curriculum to enable art students become eligible for college credit. Shannon finds being a teacher in her chosen field also enhances creativity in her art profession. In her method of teaching, she introduces "mind-mapping" (brainstorming), collect data (experimentation), posing problems/ questions, and determining shapes, whether in organic or nude form into the ceramics. Shannon forms the wet clay into shape, allows it to air-dry for a day or two, depending on the humidity and size/ shape of form, then draws a sketch, cuts out the pattern & tapes it on the "leather hard" form. The next step is to carefully inscribe around the pattern with a sharp tool, remembering the unfired piece is very fragile. Shannon mentioned the her interpretive art in the terms of "male, female gaze"-the idea of how male & female perceive identical objects or issues. (Her interpretive art is influenced by a minor degree in sociology.) She also implements a technique known as "slip trailing" in which slip (very liquid mixture of clay & water) is mixed with colored glaze and painted on the pot in several layers, then carved into to reveal underlying layers of color. When fired, the underlying layers Page 3 reveal themselves in lines of beautiful colors. Her series of ceramics include: "Mandala series" and "Women turning into Flowers." Shannon gives private lessons in ceramics as well: Students learn "throw", hand building, firing...coil method, pinch pot, slab building, and at least 2 pottery wheel projects. Mon-Wed (beginning Aug. 30th), 6-8 pm. Limit 5 students 3 wk class: \$45 6 wk class: \$ 90 1012 Clay St., Nocona, Tx. (Ceramic studio at school).
