CTAA Minutes - November 2022

Gale Cochran-Smith called the meeting to order at 6:02pm, November 10, 2022

Treasurer's Report: Gwen Coulson reported \$1,580.22 in the bank as of the October 20th statement. All invoices have been paid and all incoming monies received. Hospitality Chair: Again.....thank you Dian Roades for the refreshments! Much appreciated!

Art of the Song Art Show Recap: Although Gwen did not have exact figures, the net result of the Art of the Song Art Show was a loss in the \$300 range. In order to break even or show a profit, we would need more entries. To achieve that, we need more prize money. To solve that "chicken and egg" conundrum, we would probably need another sponsor in addition to Nocona Nights, which donated the \$500 Best of Show award. Discussion was also made that we had not anticipated having to pay 1/3 of the event insurance (our portion was \$91). We should start thinking about approaching another group to help sponsor the show next year.

Gale indicated that she considered the art show a resounding success, even with a loss - given that we had more entries than last time, and more sales than last time. The Opening Reception was well attended, and the food was a beautiful table presentation in addition to being delicious. Thank you Dian Roades!

Discussion was made that if we have any more entries next year, we will need more art panels. We can purchase similar panels to the ones donated that we used this time at a cost of around \$150 per panel, or we can have someone make heavy cloth slipcovers to pull over the wire panels that Larry has in storage. That decision will have to be made prior to next fall's show. Jesse pointed out how professional the show looked with the cloth panels as opposed to the wire racks used in previous shows. We will reconsider the topic after Soon Warren's workshop next spring, to see how much money is available.

Other Meeting Topics: We got a thank you letter from The Kemp Center for our donation for the kid's art events earlier this year, as well as information regarding the Cowboy True event. Gale will post that information on our group website.

Discussion was made regarding our next month's Christmas Party. Gwen/Jesse/Gale will ask Danny/Judi Laws if we can use the Fellowship Hall at the 7th Day Adventist Church again the evening of December 8th. Plan B is to hold it in our meeting room at the bank. Further discussion was made regarding catered food versus potluck, and the group all agreed that potluck was a better option. The art group will pay for the turkey, and the members will individually provide the rest of the feed. White Elephant Gift Exchange will be the same as last year - \$25 max cost of a wrapped gift. Presentation by Photographer Ron Ice:

Ron grew up near Saint Jo, where he graduated from high school. He earned a BS and MA degree in US History and Political Science from Texas A&M Commerce before joining the US Army for four years of service. He taught classes in high school and college before changing careers to work as a supplier for an aluminum fabrication company. After he retired in 2014, he took a photography class and became hooked. He and his wife now live at Robson Ranch near Denton, spending weekends on the family farm near Saint Jo. He is involved in a very active photography club at his community, and the hobby has now become his passion. He considers himself a "hobbiest" and says he is constantly learning new things about photography.

Ron presented a PowerPoint program on the many "Rules" of photography - the first rule being, don't always follow the rules! He said that many great photographs don't adhere in any way to the various rules about composition, lighting, framing, etc. He suggested researching a photographer whose work you like, and figure out what makes those photographs great - and copying those techniques! He also said study photographs you don't like, and figure out why you don't like them - then don't repeat those mistakes. He believes the most meaningful thing he's learned is to "first to look, and then to see." That opens up a new way of looking at things. He is always looking for new creative ways to make photographs. He said one of the mistakes is thinking you have to go somewhere new to find things to photograph. Instead, just study what is around you, and you can nearly always come up with something you never really noticed before.

All of the photographs in his presentation were his own, and some were really unusual and thought-provoking. He got us all thinking of new ways of looking at things, and said the beauty of digital photography, is that you can always delete what you don't like. Learn from your mistakes, and just keep taking photographs....NOT snapshots!




When is Cowboy True and what happens?
