Theme will be a "Cactus Rose." Fee: \$ 175-2 days; 10-4 pm each day. CTAA Meeting: Gale C. Smith, president of CTAA will be absent at the June meeting in lieu of her family member's memorial. Larry Lemons brought up a discussion concerning a memorial gift of \$ 100 to the assisted living where her mother resided. Pat Peery made the motion to contribute this amount, Jennifer Hammer seconded, motion carried unanimously. Jesse Coulsen made an additional motion to contribute \$ 500 to the Kemp Center in honor of the J.R. Cook Memorial for kids' art camp for the summer. Jennifer Hammer also seconded; vote carried also unanimously. Discussion was made concerning "Art of the Song" art show at the Justin Building in the Fall. There has been a 2 year break since the pandemic. Larry Lemons suggested an Artists' Preview Party the evening of registration, ending at 3:00 pm. \$25/3 entries.. Registration Fri. Oct 14th; Art Show-Sat. Oct 15th. Awards presented at 5:00; artists take home artwork afterword. ... \$ 500 grand prize/other awards of merit. Suggestion was made to create a separate category for the theme: "Art of the Song". Guest Artist: Joshua Bradley/ wood-turner, sculptor, silversmith, visual artist Since a previous visit, Josh Bradley has added jewelry and painting to his talented skills. His grandfather, a stone cutter, was an inspiration the lapidary process of stone finishes. Mostly self-taught, Josh learned the basic process through social media. He had several examples of his beautiful artistry, among them, an award winning squash blossom necklace, rings, bracelets, and many examples of works in process (lapidary) for jewelry, including stones adhered to nails for polishing & finishing. His jewelry resembles the style of old pawn jewelry. He also brought some great examples of paintings of wildlife. His favored medium is Liquin. As a wood turner, Josh "turns" segmented vases, bowls & vessels using many pieces of wood. His bowls can involve as many 450 separate pieces! Josh uses TiteBond glue for the intricate rows, layer by layer in his bowls. He uses many types of wood, including mesquite & walnut. The variations of color do not involve stains, paints or dyes, but most woods darken with age. His different species of wood offer varied colors which he finishes with additional coats of clear wax. He was recently partnered with a mentor through Texas Folk Life, a group that apprentices emerging artists in the arts. Josh also participated in Cowboy True, an art Exhibition held annually in Wichita Falls, Tx. He has shown his work in different museums, shows, and galleries. He is currently represented by Davis & Blevins the Main S.

Randy Meador is a wholly self-taught 2D and 3D artist from Saint Jo, Texas.



That love of the West translated into sculptures for the Chickasaw Nation, TCU Football Stadium, several municipal public works, Sorolla-inspired oil paintings, and vibrant watercolor. Randy is known for his watercolor with a long list of accolades and awards. In China, he's known as "The Cowboy," which he finds silly, because he considers himself a pretty sorry hand.

His animated and unorthodox stage presentations made him a popular museum lecturer and Western Art advocate.

Randy is a University of Oklahoma graduate and actively supports US veterans.
