CTAA Meeting Minutes

Roll Call/Minutes/Treasurer's Report:

- a. No minutes were read for the prior meeting which was held on March 9, 2017.
- b. Each member present at this meeting signed the guest book in lieu of roll call.
- c. Bank balance as of March 31, 2017 was \$1,799.20. (Gen. Ledger \$699.20 and \$1,100.00 workshop).

Business:

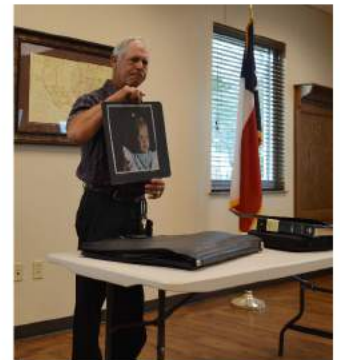

This Year's Juror: John Cook, Highland Village, TX

There is a spontaneous nature to his paintings that conveys his need to quickly achieve the essence of light as it dances, pierces, careens and bounces to find its way throughout the subject. From still life to portraits, landscapes, architecture, and his native-Texas western imagery, nothing is too small or too large for John to attempt as is demonstrated in his diverse range of subject matter.

Most canvases are produced in his Highland Village, Texas studio where he has resided for 31 years. However, painting outdoors often presents some of his favorite small format "jewels" and many are kept in his personal collection.

Exhibitions include the prestigious WH Patterson gallery in London, with members of Parliament visiting. As well as shows in New York, Colorado, California, Florida, South Carolina, Indiana, Arizona, and many venues from Texas and Oklahoma. Also, John has had 12 annual solo shows at SW Gallery, Dallas.



John was born in Dallas, Texas and attended school at the University of Texas at Arlington and the Art Center School in Los Angeles, where he received a Bachelor of Professional Arts Degree.

The CTAA is proud announce the first Western Art Show & Sale.

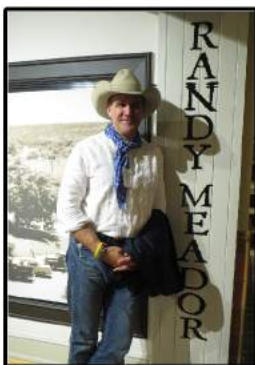
Joining the Chisholm Trail Art Association, The Tales 'N' Trails Museum in Nocona, TX will host the event at the Museum.

Larry G. Lemons will present a program entitled "From Georgia O'Keeffe to George Rodrigue' to Loony Toons." Lemons will show and discuss how his colorful and iconic Texas art has been inspired by the work of other noted artists resulting in art lovers from all over the country acquiring his work. Seventeen years ago he and his wife, Donna, sold their successful photography business for Larry to pursue a second career in oil painting specializing in iconic Texas and Southwestern images and teaching art to young people. Larry's work has been a part of the Trail of Painted Ponies, licensed by Texas Highways magazine and the City of North Richland Hills. He has had one artist shows at the Booth Western Art Museum Borderlands Gallery in Cartersville, Georgia, and Kemp Center for the Arts Northlight Gallery. He has been a nominee for Texas State Artist in the 2D category and recently appeared on Texas Country Reporter, a nationally syndicated television program. Lemons will retire from teaching art at Saint Jo Elementary School in May.
