
CTAA March Minutes

Guest Artist: Dave Shafer, photographer Dave Shafer, originally from Pennsylvania, is a photographer with a rich background of experience. In the early years, he was introduced by his father to the camera & the processing of film in the darkroom, in addition to baseball. Having been a professional photographer for over 25 years, he has been involved with assignments leading him to local and exotic places such as rodeos to the Bahamas. Dave loves people and unusual places. He is always looking for sunrises and sunsets, interesting characters (Tony Romo), human interest photos such the training of a matador in South Texas. He looks for light, color, gesture, composition-"gritty to cute." CTAA was given a remarkable tour of his career through the lens of a photo projector presentation-Personal projects such as a "lineman's rodeo," Cowboys of Color, the 2nd Air Division (his father was a B 52 bomber pilot), scenes of the historical Stockyards in Ft. Worth, Tx, dance halls to photographing a worker hanging windmills at 300' high! Texas Highways commissioned him to photo shoot a project called "The Big Easy" which involved a series "Boogie Woogie music" connected with trains. Another special project included Brandon the Clown with children at a calf scramble on muddy ground. To achieve this shot, he had to change locations to find the right atmosphere... Rockport, Tx after a hurricane, still shots of Medicine Mount with a descendent of Quana Parker, g-g-grandson, Ron Parker. His advice..."Take your best shot, even if it's never published." Dave makes the viewer feel as though he is part of the picture. Dave's career included clients such as The Texas Highways, Eastman Kodak, New Hampshire Tourism, Michelob Brewing, United Healthcare, Fortune, and Texas Highways magazine. He is recipient of 5 Communication Arts Photography Awards of Excellence and recently named "Photographer of the Year-2020-from the Int'l Regional Magazine Association. Randy Meador

ARTIST OF THE AMERICAN WEST

Current Meador Art Collector: "Why on earth would I spend good money on something that just hangs on a wall?"

Meador: "Perhaps to remind you why you're alive. It's a mirror that reflects the best of your past, present, and future."

Randy Meador is a wholly self-taught 2D and 3D artist from Saint Jo, Texas.

Born just a stone's throw from the Waggoner Ranch in Vernon, Texas and raised on a smaller ranch in Central West Texas, he fell in love with hues and heritage of the West.

That love of the West translated into sculptures for the Chickasaw Nation, TCU Football Stadium, several municipal public words, Sorolia-inspired oil paintings, and vibrant watercolor. Randy is known for his watercolor with a long list of accolades and awards. In China, he's known as "The Cowboy," which he finds silly, because he considers himself a pretty sorry hand.

His animated and unorthodox stage presentations made him a popular museum lecturer and Western Art advocate.

Randy is a University of Oklahoma graduate and actively supports US veterans.
