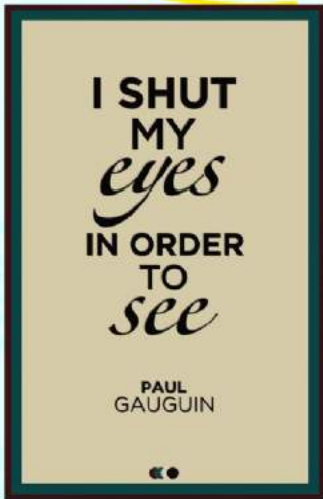

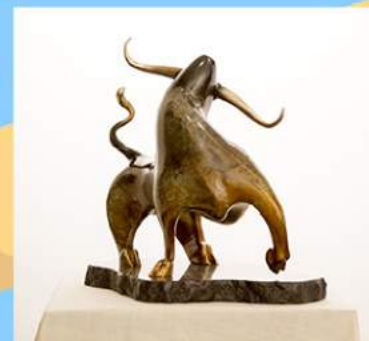

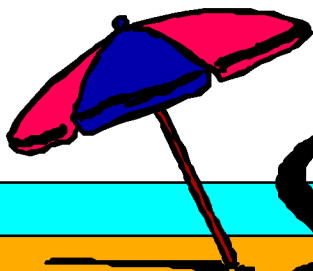

Randy Meador brings his high-energy, unorthodox workshop "That's Not Watercolor!" to Davis & Blevins Gallery in historic Saint Jo, Texas, October 20-22. The workshop cost is \$200 for 2 1/2 days of fun and will forever change how you view watercolor --and maybe art altogether.

Randy says, "This new workshop can at times resemble a stage show or stand up routine, and it's a lot of fun. You will not be bored, but I'm serious about watercolor, and I'm very serious about breaking folks free to paint like their hair's on fire."

And this workshop is designed to do just that... forever break bad habits and free artists from lifeless, dull, or timid watercolors. He also reveals secrets most professionals don't know... secrets hard-won in the valleys and peaks of life. He coaches with a special blend of humor and virtue...and on occasion, a little "crazy."

Randy strongly urges oil and acrylic artists to attend. He says, "When you can create vibrant watercolor, you have acquired the ability to make quick, accurate, and confident decisions. When you paint decisively, you can do anything... and in any medium... including three dimensional."

Who comes to *That's Not Watercolor*?

Evidently everyone," says Randy. "At almost every event, I have an attendee who has no art experience at all. They come because they heard it was fun and wanted to try it, often with friends. On the other hand, I've been shocked at, and humbled by, the number of full-time artists who attend. Often first-timers understand my techniques before full-timers."

## ACADIAN DUSTED SHRIMP

From Jack Milchanowski

### ACADIAN DUST

- 3 tablespoons paprika
- 1 ½ tablespoons granulated garlic
- 1 tablespoon black pepper
- 1 tablespoon white pepper
- 1 tablespoon onion powder
- 1 tablespoon cayenne
- 1 tablespoon dried oregano
- 1 tablespoon dried thyme

### SHRIMP

24-Shrimp peeled and de-veined

Combine 3 tablespoons vegetable oil with 1 tablespoon of extra virgin olive oil

1. Combine all Acadian Dust ingredients and mix well.
2. Salt shrimp and lightly coat with Acadian Dust
3. Combine oils in a deep skillet, then heat to smoking-hot. Sear shrimp on both sides to slightly blacken.
4. Serve and enjoy.

## CUBAN-STYLE PORK CHOPS (Charcoal grilled)

From Jack Milchanowski

- 4 bone-in pork chops (1" thick)
- 1 small onion, cut into eighths
- 2 large cloves garlic, roughly chopped
- ¾ cup fresh orange juice
- 3 tbs fresh lime juice plus 1 tbs zest
- 1 cup cilantro
- 1 tbs fresh oregano
- 1 tbs extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 tsp salt
- ¼ tsp black pepper

Place pork chops, onion and garlic in a large reseal able plastic bag. Whisk remaining ingredients and pour over pork chops in bag, tossing to coat. Marinate 1 hour at room temperature.

Heat grill or grill pan to medium. Remove pork chops from marinade. Grill 8-10 minutes per side, until internal temperature reaches 140 degrees on an instant-read thermometer. Let rest 5 minutes before serving; temperature will increase to 145 degrees.

## Aunt Reva's Meatball Chowder (makes 6-7 quarts)

From Gale Cochran-Smith

- 2# ground beef
- 2 tsp seasoning salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 2 eggs - slightly beaten
- 1/4 c chopped fresh parsley
- 1/3 c fine cracker crumbs
- 2 Tbsp milk

Combine above ingredients into small balls and roll in flour. Brown meatballs (or you can drop them unbrowned in the soup after you get it going).

- 4 onions, cut in eighths
- 6 c water
- 6 c tomato juice (48 oz)
- 6 beef bullion cubes (or equivalent beef stock or granules)
- 6 carrots (3 cups) sliced
- 3-4 stalks celery sliced
- 2 to 3 potatoes, cubed (2-3 cups)
- 1/4 c long grain rice
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 2 tsp salt
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/2 to 1 tsp marjoram
- 1 can mexicorn

Combine all above ingredients except corn, and bring to boil. Cover and simmer for 30 minutes or until potatoes are soft. Add corn in the last 10 minutes. Add spinach leaves or kale at the end and stir. If you want the soup more creamy and less tomatoey, add a bit of half and half or cream.

This soup freezes well. Cut it in half if you are serving less than 8 people.
