Sept-Ann Ayers/ Sculpture Guest Artist: Susan Moody (Textile Artist)

Susan and her husband are owners of Blue Dog Moon Fiber Arts, a loom weaving company that produces handwoven "useful" goods, including shawls, purses, saddle bags, hatbands, guitar straps, foot stool covers, bookmarks, etc. Susan is an entrepreneur with many talents. She comes from a BFA in historical studies, in the Page 2

origins of weaving since early civilization. A former teacher in a Christian school, she & her husband are also WWII reenactors and former owners of a restaurant business in Saint Jo, Texas.

Susan gave a brief history of fiber arts beginning in the Bronze Age, involving historical culture of hand weaving of ship sails, saddle blankets, material for tents, etc. She then discussed the use of drop spindles for spinning threads, several types

of weaving looms and their different features according to the region in which they evolved. Scandinavian looms used "band looms" to produce intricate patterns, while "triangle" looms yielded smaller decorative straps for suspenders and edging for clothing. Her yarns are obtained from estate sales, various vendor sales and yard (garage) sales. She also finds Sari silk scarves to cut into thin threads for

her yard stashes.

Another fascinating feature of her demo was the Saori Loom (Japanese..meaning "barefoot") which involved 2 frames (heddles) for separating the yarn to weave pattern. The separation involved pressing on wooden peddles attached to the frames with 'bare feet'! The philosophy involved the atmosphere of creating peace while weaving. This encourages the woven piece to have uniqueness in creativity, usually involving no formal pattern.

Susan has 4 kinds of looms in her weaving studio which includes a rage of 2, 4, & 8 heddles. Other terms she used were: warp (vertical threads under tension) and weft (horizontal threads) and the shuttle (that passes through the threads). A most interesting lesson on another art form using exciting color and textures that excite the soul! Artist of the Month: Karen Kennedy Chatham-"Semper Fi"-digita art...16 x 20" CTAA meeting was dismissed at



- Work should be ready for presentation = no 'sawtooth' hangers = framed pieces must have a hanging wire.
- Gallery wrapped pieces must be on a canvas of at least 1 " in depth with a hanging wire
- Work should be "sale ready" properly mounted and framed. Please put your name on the back of all entries. Glass display cases will be provided for small/delicate 3D entries.
- Three dimensional work should be accompanied by it's own display stand if too large to fit in a display case
- Two dimensional work larger than 30"x 30" will require the artist to provide an easel. GAVA reserves the right to exclude any item deemed inappropriate for the Fall Art Exhibition
- 20% of sales go to GAVA. Payment for sold works will be made within 30 days of show closing.
