Chisholm Trail Art Association January Meeting Minutes

CTAA Meeting Minutes January 11, 2019

President Gale opened our January "Show 'n Tell" meeting, and asked for a discussion concerning the tenure of the current officers. No one has volunteered to take any of the officer positions, and after some bantering, we voted to keep the current officers for another year – ONLY. Larry mentioned that we may consider having programs less often, and substitute watching training videos, or asking members to help with putting on the programs – maybe by offering a demo in their artistic area. Attending members decided that would be interesting for all of us. We will ask members to host demos at the meetings, and that way we could have an outside artist demonstrate once per quarter, instead of every month. We all need to assist with locating artists willing to conduct presentations at our meetings. Please let Larry know your suggestions.

The Treasurer's report showed \$1,221.59.

Gale also discussed the following:

- Reminder that the CTAA juried art show will be held in Larry Lemon's Studio in Nocona. The theme is Native American. The juried show will run from May 3 – May 10 to coincide with Cruisin' Nocona (May 2-4). Deadline for entry will be April 1, with entry acceptance notification by April 17. All entries will be delivered April 26-28. The entries will be hung April 28 – 29. Judging will be April 30 - May 1. Opening Reception for the juried show will be May 4 from 2-5pm. All work must be picked up May 11-12. Further information and entry forms will be provided after the holidays.
- Jennifer Hammer's reception for her OPOMAC show will be held on March 9 from 1-3 pm, at the OPOMAC in Graham. CTAA will hold our March meeting at that reception. Please note your calendars.
- Gale will have a show at the Forum in Wichita Falls, from March 1 through May 11. We will hold the April CTAA meeting as a field trip to the Forum during Gale's show. Date to be determined.
- Reminder that dues are now due.
- More workshops and shows in 2019 to consider:
 - There will be a pastel workshop, given by Janet Thompson, April 7-13, 2019, that will be held at the 404 Ranch, north of Stephenville. That is the same one Gale and Jennifer attended last year – they loved it. There are still some openings. If you have any interest in learning pastel painting, this would be a good workshop to attend.
 - We've also scheduled Soon Warren's 2019 watercolor workshop for July 19, 20, & 21. Her workshop is currently full with a wait list. If you're interested, add you name to the wait list – never can tell what will happen over time.
 - The Vaquero Western Art Show is currently at the Ft Worth Community Art Center.

Show 'n Tell-

- Jennifer talked about, and demonstrated framing techniques. She hunts through thrift shops looking for frames, and can usually buy them for \$10 or less. She showed how she repairs them for use - sands them, paints them, cuts mats, and then frames the painting. You could not tell any frame had been damaged. I think everyone will head for thrift shops now.
- Brittany showed her pencil drawings. She sketches anything on any piece of paper she can get her hands on, from cute characters, to human figures. She has an amazing sense of composition.
- Larry demo'd some of his paintings on his phone. The back of a beautiful old car with fins was one, and the dogs. We all love Larry's work.
- Gale told us about the new exhibit in the west wing of the Nocona Tales and Trails Museum, that she's responsible for designing. She has to build a mural depicting the old west, and she decided to use wallpaper for the design. So, she found a variety of old west pictures, organized them into one, long, mural-like setting, and now has an old west theme with a town, cattle, etc., on wall paper that will be hung by a professional. She has also hired a mural artist to paint the sky above the wall paper scene. We all applauded her efforts!
- Vonnie discussed and showed a few of her paintings. One being a painting of her granddaughter sitting on a stairway resting after the Homeschool Prom – shoes off. I think that feeling has been shared by every woman who attended a dance. Another painting was a unique still life of vases with peace roses, along with a clock and rabbit – very peaceful painting.
- Angela showed the mural she has been working on at Amazon in her "spare time." Beautiful old west mural with Longhorns, a western town, cattle and cowboys – a mural of Texas culture that her CEO asked her to paint. Very talented woman.
- Jody showed some of her watercolors, including one she calls "Winters Ride." It's an old turquoise/blue pickup truck in the snow. Then she showed a watercolor of a lizard she painted for grandsons, called "Mugly Ugly." So ugly, he's cute. She also showed a work-in-progress of an old silo and barn from TN. She said she crawled over a fence to get a good photo, and was glad there was no one around to see her.
