

January Meeting

Monthly Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2015

Call to Order:

Gale Cochran-Smith called to order the business meeting of the Chisholm Trail Art Association (CTAA) at the Chisholm Trail Room at the Wellington State Bank in Bowie at 6pm.

Roll Call/Minutes/Treasurer's Report:

- a. No minutes were read for the prior meeting which was held on November 13, 2014.
- b. Each member present at this meeting signed the guest book in lieu of roll call.
- c. Bank balance as of December 31, 2014 was \$828.53.

Business:


CTAA Program Chairman!





Earl Deaver has been working in clay since the late 1950's. He has learned processes from several well known artists, using several different types of clay to do his pieces. He also uses a number of different glazes and types of firing, including using wood for fuel, raku firings, electric kiln firings for cone 6 glazes

and cone 10 glazes, and his downdraft gas kiln for his cone 10 glazes that require reduction firings.



Sylvia Deaver is a former teacher of industrial art. Her interest favors the more tactile experiences and the media of clay. Her clay objects are often used as carriers for designs



of the Southwest, often geometric designs in pottery and clay masks. Earl and Sylvia are both members of GAVA.


