Workshop with Randy Meador

Taming the Watercolor Beast

"Attending a Randy Meador watercolor workshop is like drinking from a fire hydrant."

Randy Meador brings his high-energy, unorthodox workshop "Taming the Watercolor Beast" to Weatherford, Friday May 23rd & 24th.

Randy says, "This new workshop can at times resemble a stage show or stand up routine, and it's a lot of fun. You will not be bored, but I'm serious about watercolor and I'm very serious about breaking folks free to paint like their hair's on fire."

And this workshop is designed to do just that... forever break bad habits and free artists from lifeless, dull, or timid watercolors. He also reveals secrets most professionals don't know... secrets hard-won in the valleys and peaks of life. He coaches with a special blend of humor and virtue.

Randy strongly urges oil and acrylic artists to attend. He says, "When you can create vibrant watercolor, you have acquired the ability to make quick, accurate, and confident decisions. When you paint decisively, you can paint anything... and in any medium."

Who comes to Taming the Watercolor Beast?

"Evidently everyone," says Randy. "At almost every event, I have an attendee who has no art experience at all. They come because they heard it was fun and wanted to try it, often with friends. On the other hand, I've been shocked at, and humbled by, the number of full-time artists who attend."

"I won't guarantee you will paint like Winslow Homer. You'll be better than a second-rate someone else; you'll be a first rate you. You'll have no need to copy

Randy Meador is a wholly self-taught artist without any instruction except his own exhaustive study of works by Winslow Homer, John Singer Sargent, and Paul Cézanne.

Born just a stone's throw from the Waggoner Ranch in Vernon, Texas and raised on a smaller ranch in Central West Texas, he fell in love with the hues of the West and returned to those hues in 2007 as a full time artist.

Randy currently lives in Fort Worth with his wife and two remaining children (of five) and has a PO box in Clifton, Texas.

In 2012 Randy began accepting workshop and demo requests. His animated and unorthodox presentations are filling much of his 2014 schedule.

Randy:

- Is the current Texas Watercolorist of the Year.
- Designed several 12-foot stone relief panels for new TCU stadium.
 - Has been awarded Best of Show in five international exhibitions.
- Is a frequent watercolor exhibition juror.
- Regularly lectures museum staff, students, teachers, and enthusiasts concerning western art and watercolor technique.
