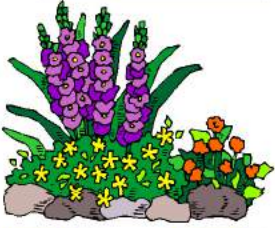

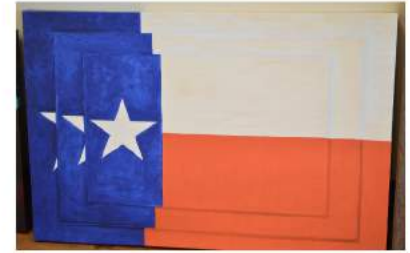
# CTAA May Meeting

2017 Marks the 26th Annual Juried Art Show Competition and Sale. We're hoping to have the largest number of entries ever for this national/international show. The exhibition will be in our Main and East Galleries from July 18th through September 9th, 2017. Competition includes 2D and 3D art awarding \$6000 in prize money. Artwork should be no older than 3 years. We hope you enter and/or come and see the incredible artwork on display.

### **This Year's Juror: John Cook, Highland Village, TX**

There is a spontaneous nature to his paintings that conveys his need to quickly achieve the essence of light as it dances, pierces, careens and bounces to find its way throughout the subject. From still life to portraits, landscapes, architecture, and his native-Texas western imagery, nothing is too small or too large for John to attempt as is demonstrated in his diverse range of subject matter.

Most canvases are produced in his Highland Village, Texas studio where he has resided for 31 years. However, painting outdoors often presents some of his favorite small format "jewels" and many are kept in his personal collection.

Exhibitions include the prestigious W H Patterson gallery in London, with members of Parliament visiting. As well as shows in New York, Colorado, California, Florida, South Carolina, Indiana, Arizona, and many venues from Texas and Oklahoma. Also, John has had 12 annual solo shows at SW Gallery, Dallas.

John was born in Dallas, Texas and attended school at the University of Texas at Arlington and the Art Center School in Los Angeles, where he received a Bachelor of Professional Arts Degree.

## Call to Artists for the Eleventh Annual

*Mystery Art* Exhibit: September 29 – October 27, 2017

Artist Opening Reception: Thursday,  
September 28th

from 5:30 pm - 7:30 pm

- The donation of your original, non-mechanically produced art will be part of a fundraising art exhibit and competition that will feature regional artists who have ties to Texoma. Each work of art will be displayed anonymously. Only when the artwork is purchased will the new owner discover who created the masterpiece.
- Please bring your original art to the Kemp Center for the Arts at 1300 Lamar on or before **Wednesday, September 6, 2017**. Each piece must be accompanied by an entry form provided by the Kemp Center. Entries will not be accepted after 5:00 pm on that date. Entries that are still wet or have been signed on the front will not be accepted.
- There will be TWO art divisions – Adult and Youth. Artists participating in the Adult Division must be 18 years or older. The Youth Division is for artists 17 years and younger. The guidelines apply to both the Adult and Youth divisions.
  - Your completed original artwork must be 8" X 10" and cannot be larger or smaller. You will need to provide your own canvas. Acceptable media: oil, acrylic, watercolor, glass, mosaic, mixed, or other forms as approved by staff. We cannot accept photography, digital artwork, or jewelry. Art can be three-dimensional or two-dimensional wall hangings, as long as it does not extend more than four inches from the wall. Free standing sculptures must fit within the confines of an 8"x8"x10" box. Artists select the category for their artwork. The categories are Abstract, Landscape, Animal, Still Life, Symbolism, Floral, Sculpture, or Persona. Category are defined on line at [artscouncilwf.org](http://artscouncilwf.org).
- Artist donations/entries are limited to two for 2017 and must be original work not copied from copyrighted or published art or published photographs. All entries become the property of the Kemp. **PLEASE SIGN your work on the back.**
- Artwork will be judged by **Randy Meador** on Thursday, September 28, 2017. There will be awards in all categories, including "Best of Show." An Artist's Reception will be on September 28th at 5:30 pm where the awards will be announced and your friends and family are invited to be the first to see your gallery.
- Artwork produced on stretched canvas must be painted on all sides since it will not be framed. All other two-dimensional art will be framed by the Kemp. All art will be displayed in the NorthLight Gallery.
- Your works of art will be viewed in the NorthLight Gallery from September 29th – October 27th, with the Mystery Art Fest party and auction starting at 6:00 pm on Friday, October 27, 2017. The proud new owners will be allowed to take the art home at the close of the evening.
- Again for 2017, each work of art in the Adult Division will be sold with the bidding starting at \$35.00. When the bidding reaches \$125.00 on a piece and another bidder matches the bid, the piece will be sent to a live auction. Bidding for the Youth Division will start at \$5.00.
  - Proxy Bids will be accepted from September 29th – October 25th.

There will be a 20% commission to WAA on all artwork sold. All works in the adult category MUST be for sale and remain so for the duration of the show. Max image size 36"x48" including frame. Max weight 35#.

Adult entries must have screw eyes and wires. Student entries must have a rigid backing for hanging.

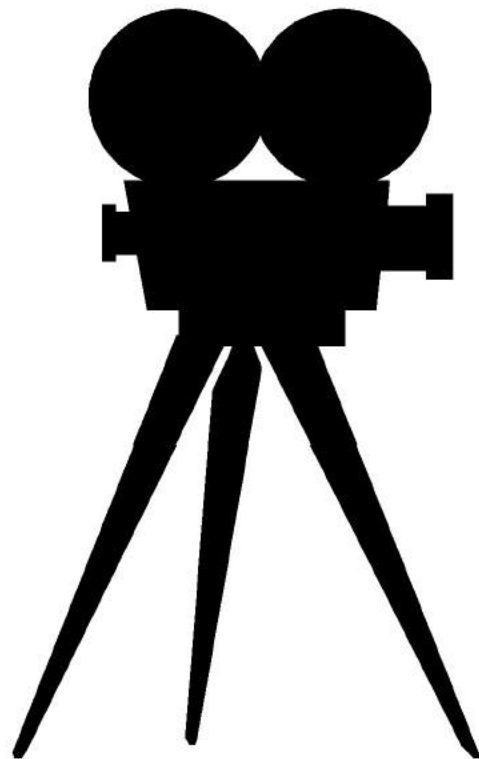
