

## CTAA Recipes!

### Legendary Lion House Rolls

from Jennifer Hammer \*\*See for bread machine instructions\*\*

### Ingredients:

2 - cups warm water

2/3 - cup nonfat dry milk

2 - tablespoons active dry yeast

1/4 - cup sugar

2 - teaspoon salt

1/3 - cup butter

1 - egg

5 - 51/2 - cups all purpose flour

### Directions:

In your mixer combine water and dry milk. Stir until dissolved. Add yeast, sugar, salt, butter, egg and 2 cups flour.

Mix on low speed until ingredients are wet, then for 2 minutes on medium speed. Add 2 more cups flour, and mix on low speed until ingredients are wet, and 2 minutes on medium speed.

Add remaining flour (I only add one more cup, and leave out the last 1/2). Once combined, knead with hands

Place dough in a oiled bowl. Turn over once so dough is covered with oil. Cover with plastic, and let rise in a warm place until double in size. Place dough on floured surface.

Roll out dough, and brush with melted butter. Cut rolls into desired shape and size. Place on a greased or parchment paper lined baking pan. Let rise in warm place until rolls are doubled in size. If you want to make them in the shape pictured above you can find a Youtube video for a demo.

Bake at 375 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes or until browned. Brush with melted butter while hot.

\*\*My changes to the recipe: In your bread machine first put in the egg and the liquid ingredients. On top of the liquids, put in the flour, dry milk, sugar, salt and then make a small indentation to put the yeast in (make sure the yeast does not touch the liquids) DO NOT STIR. Cut the butter into tablespoon size and leave on top of everything. Set your bread machine to the dough cycle. After the first rise take the dough out and proceed through the rest of the recipe as written.\*\*

## Squash Casserole

from Linda Makinney

6 medium yellow squash sliced thin 1 tbl spoon butter

1 cup Cheddar cheese

onion sliced thin
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/2 cup sour cream

French's fried onions

Saute with olive oil the onions & squash until soft and most water boiled out of squash. Remove the pot from the fire & add in the cheese & sour cream, Stir it up good to mix it up then pour into a greased casserole dish. Bake @ 350 for about 20 minutes. Don't forget to put the French fried onions on top for about 5 minutes

It is so good both friends & family will enjoy eating.

## Swedish Tårta (Celebration Cake)

Bake yellow box cake as per directions on box. Turn on cooling racks as soon as possible. While cake is cooling do the following:

1 large Jell-O cook and serve vanilla pudding mix (cook as directed, cool).

Round Cake: (follow same directions for oblong cake).

Separate cake layers into 4 layers. (I use sewing thread for best results)

Spread the cooled pudding on each layer, except the top layer. Put in refrigerator overnight.

Next day whip up heavy cream so you can spread like frosting. (be careful not to make butter).

Add sugar to the whipped cream to taste.

Frost the cake on all sides and on top of cake with whipping cream.

Add fruits on top for garnish such as strawberries cut in half,
blueberries, kiwi, Maraschino cherries, Mandarin oranges, (bananas
can be added just before serving).
