CTAA Meeting Minutes

President Gale Cochran-Smith opened the meeting. There were some general comments before our guest artist, Cynthia Westbrook, gave her presentation.

- The results from Soon Warren's workshop were: 20 people for \$3,000. We had a net profit of \$810, and donated \$300 to the church for use of their space. We had \$510 left for CTAA.
- Gale talked briefly about the Phillips Collection at the Kimball that was our August field trip. We met for lunch at Blue Mesa Grill, and then enjoyed the very interesting and unusual collection at the Kimball.
- We discussed the CTAA juried Western Art Show and Sale. Jennifer Hammer won Best of Show and People's Choice. Overall, the show was well attended, and we only lost \$80.
- The Treasurer's Report showed a balance of \$468.29 with additional dues of \$70 being received at the meeting.
- We have another Soon Warren workshop scheduled for July 18, 19, 20, 2018. Will keep everyone updated in the future.
- Our October guest presenter will be Larry W. Hamilton. Larry paints extremely realistically almost like looking at a photograph. He's from Wichita Falls, and, at the recent Breckenridge Juried Art Show, he has been awarded the Fine Art Center Award for his painting, "Three Brushes," and also awarded the Juror's Award for his painting "Oliver." Our guest artist, Cynthia Westbrook, gave a fascinating presentation in the use of alcohol inks on ceramic glazed tiles, and yupo paper. Really interesting watching her move the colors around on the tiles to get different effects. She used rubbing alcohol as a solvent, and in spray form, with brushes, or with Q-tips to achieve unusual beauty and movement with the colors. Cynthia did several designs showing us different techniques, and even showed us how to finish the tiles after the inks dry – using an acrylic gloss spray or super glaze from Home Depot. I think all of us left with design ideas – Jesse Coulson said he will use the inks and tiles for the top of a table he's refinishing.

Jody McCabe won Artist of the Month, with her watercolor "Spring."


